The children in Malawi already show great talent when it comes to creating things with limited resources, so the team wants to support them. The Bionic Broncos realize how fortunate they are to have the school and community support them when it comes to robotics.

Pastor Lewis Carlson of St. Paul Lutheran Church in Temperance will deliver the Legos during his upcoming mission trip. He is assisting with the project of bringing good water to remote communities of the country.

Malawi is a landlocked country in southeast Africa that was formerly known as Nyasaland. It is bordered by Zambia to the northwest, Tanzania to the northeast and Mozambique

on the east, south and west. The country is separated from Tanzania and Mozambique by Lake Malawi.

Malawi is over 45,560 sq. mi. in size with an estimated population of 16,777,547. It is among the smallest countries in Africa. Lake Malawi takes up about a third of the country's area.

It is among the world's least-developed countries with an economy that is mostly agricultural and a population that is largely rural.

In Malawi primary education is not compulsory. The country's constitution does require that all people of the country be entitled to at least

five years of primary education. Since 1994, there has been free primary education for all children.

Help the Bionic Broncos achieve their goal of filling suitcases for Pastor Carlson to deliver to children in Malawi and giving them the tools to further their creativity.
